Chantel Lee Burton, 26, passed away on May 31, 2019 in Anchorage, Alaska. She was born in Apple Valley, California to Darrell and Natasha (Dancer) Burton on December 18, 1992. Chantel attended Sierra High School in Manteca, California. Not only was she intelligent, but also a student athlete; playing volleyball and throwing shotput and discus for the track & field team. She enlisted in the United States Air Force immediately after graduating in 2011; proudly and honorably serving our country for 6 years from November 2011 to November 2017. Chantel obtained her Associates Degree in Logistics from the Community College of the Air Force in 2017. Although most of her service was spent stationed at Offutt Air Base in Omaha, Nebraska; Airman Burton also had the opportunity to deploy and complete assignments in Japan, Qatar, Kuwait and Oman where her fierce desire to travel was born.
